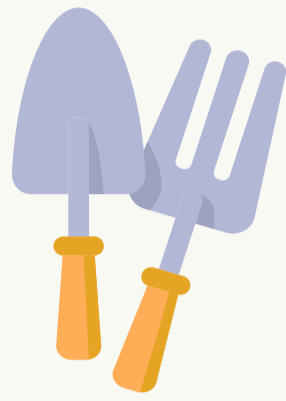

Open habitats



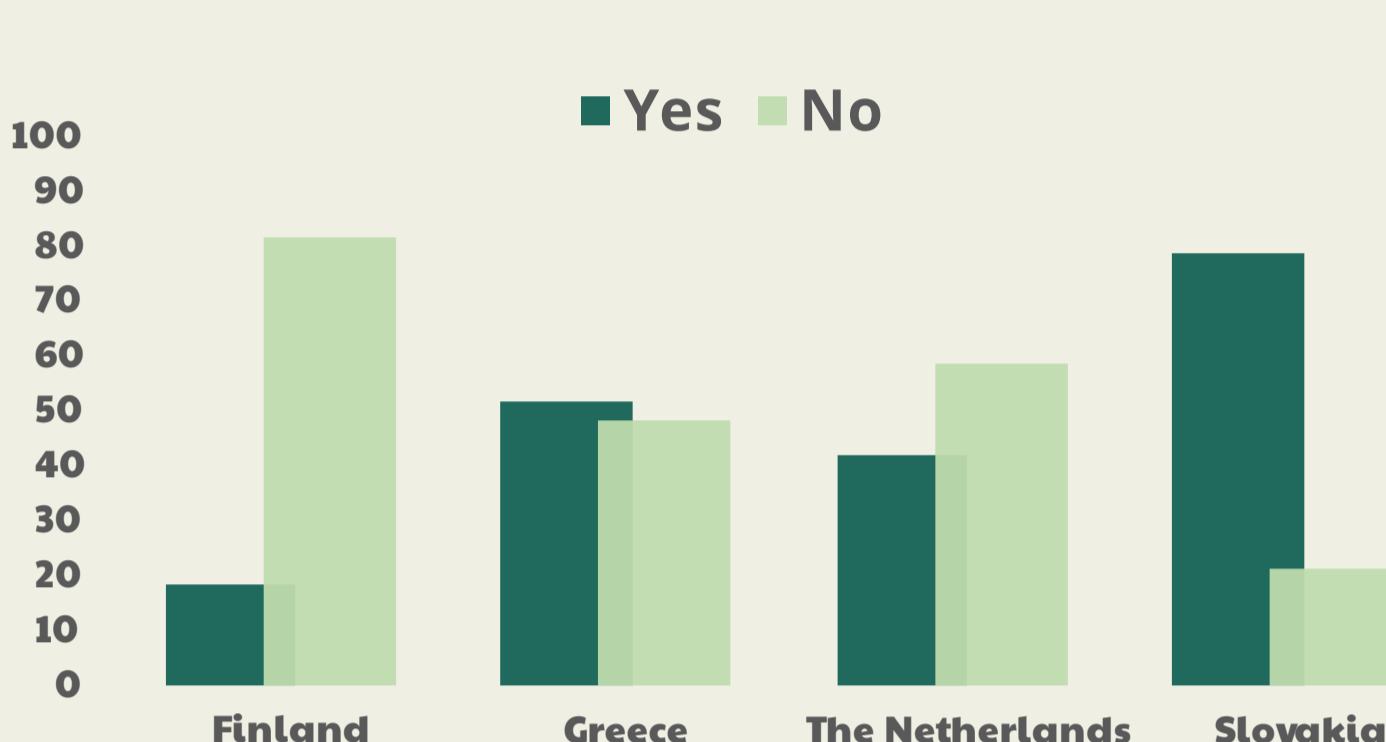
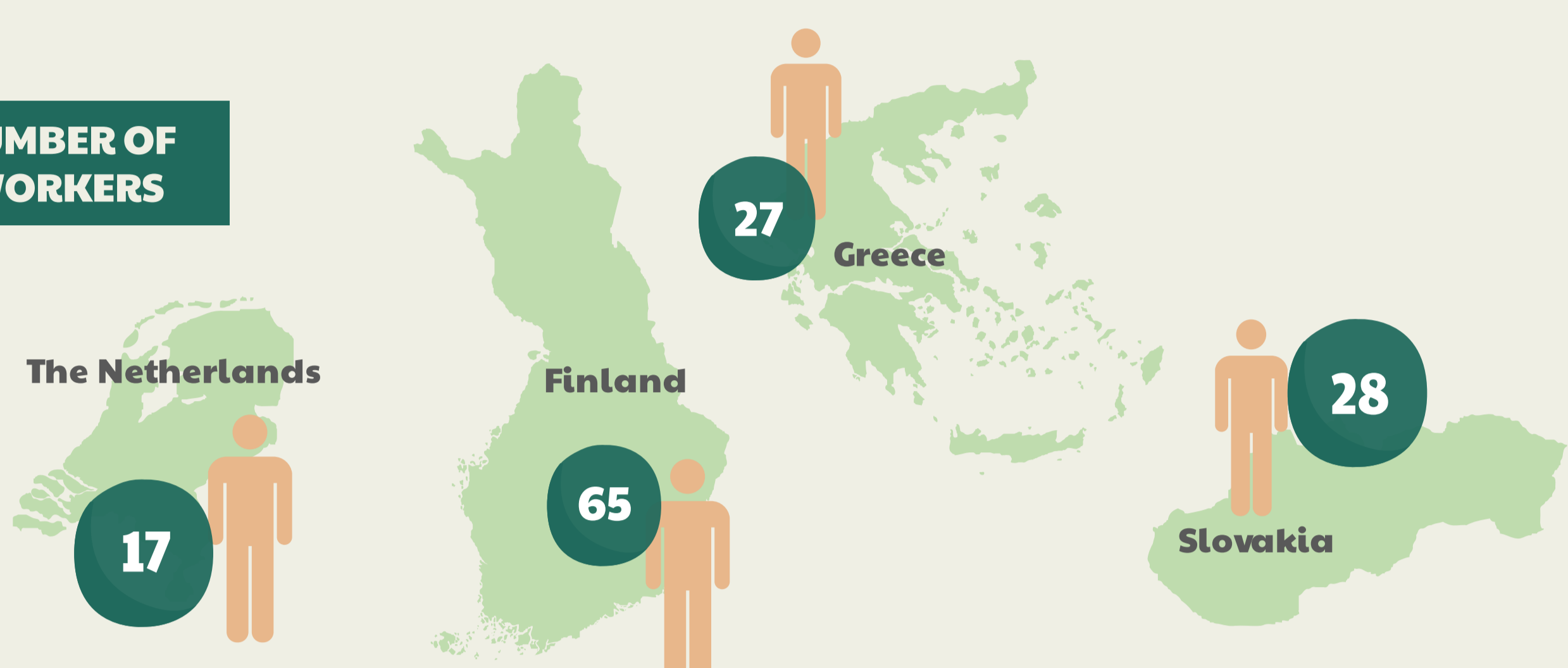
Mowing/cutting hay with a scythe or removing shrubs by hand or shovel.

River/stream Restoration



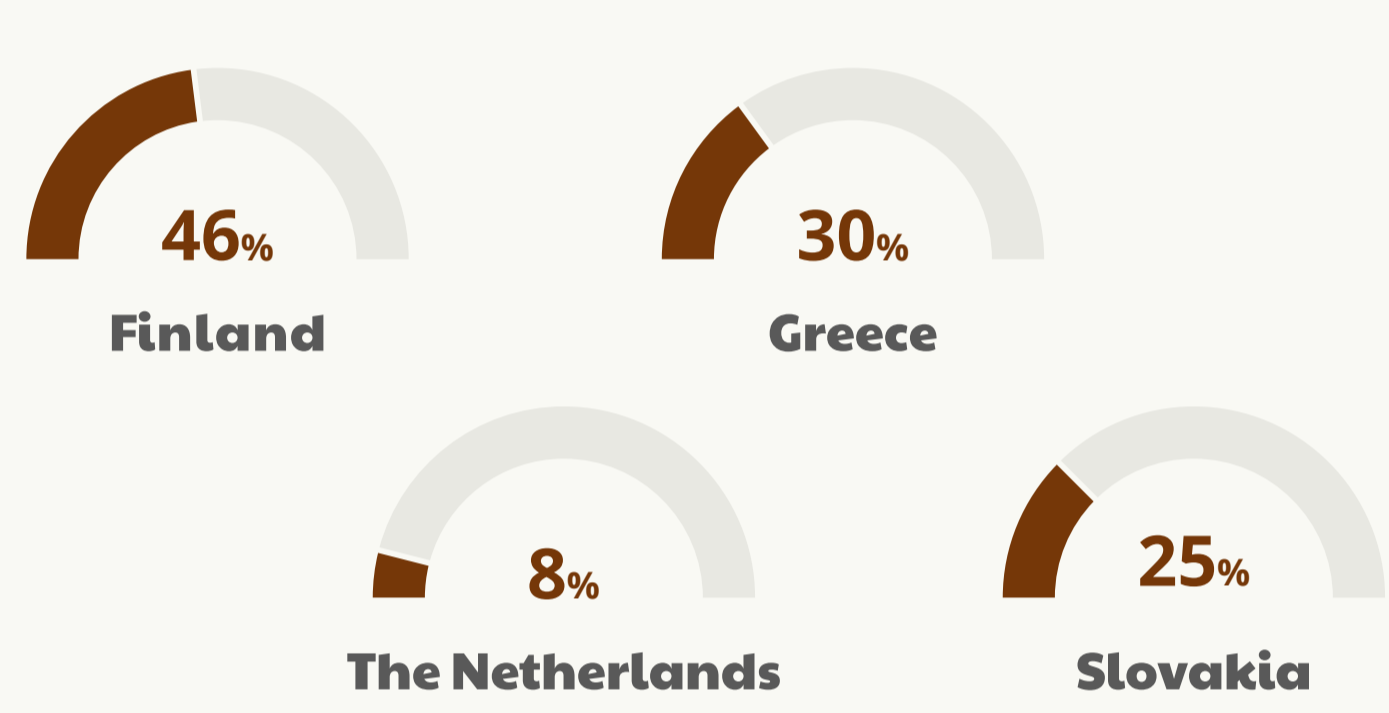
Removing possible human-made barriers, putting back rocks, pebbles, and wood, to create a diverse river habitat.

I felt I was lacking skills in order to deliver the activity efficiently (Agree and strongly agree (%))

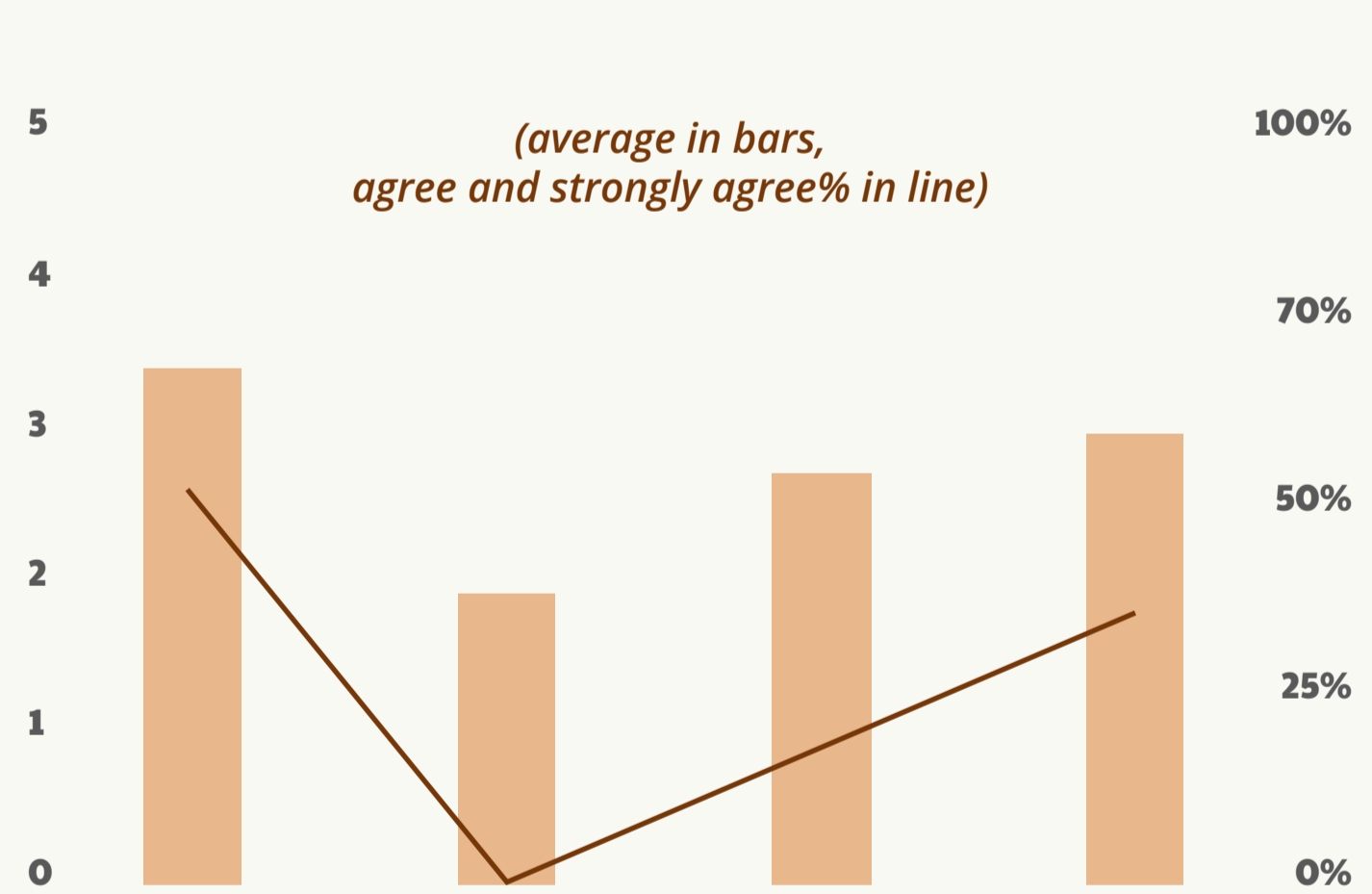


The positive impact of nature-based environmental education activities is confirmed by all four countries.



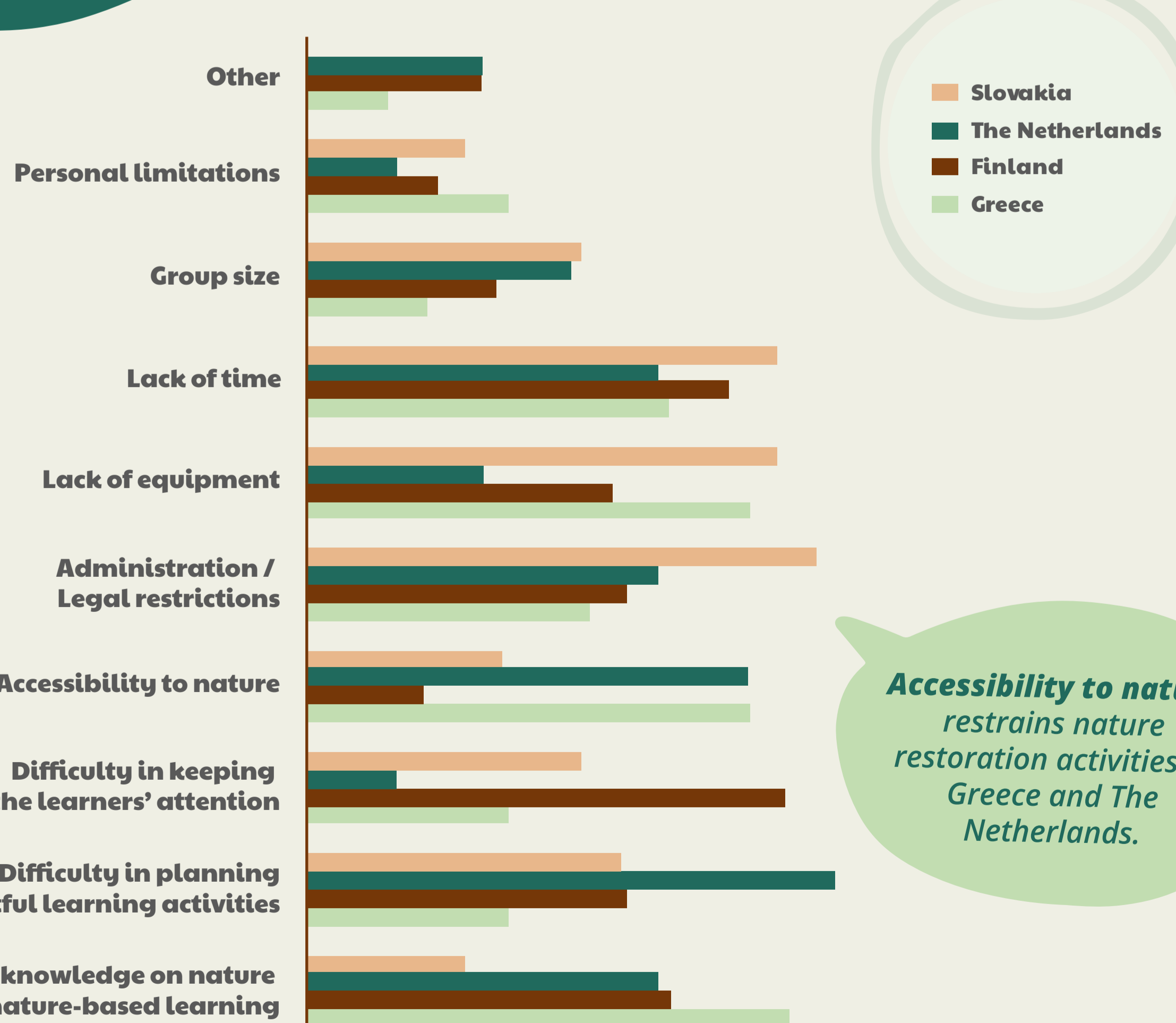
